## A Journey Down the memory Lane:-









DAY 01 ARRIVE DELHI
DELHI – AGRA 205 KMS, 4.5 HRS

On arrival in Delhi: You will be met by company representative at the arrival lounge of the airport, who will assist you and will take you directly for the City tour of Old and New Delhi covering:-

**Qutab Minar**, the tallest stone tower in India. The Qutab Minar was started in 1199 AD by Qutab-ud-Din Aibak and completed by the sultan's successor and son-in-law, Iltutmish. The building is 72.5 m high and has 379 steps from the bottom to the top. The Minar is tapering with the diameter of the base is 14.3 m while at the top floor it is2.7 m. The Qutab Minar is still the highest stone tower as well as one of the finest Islamic structures ever raised in India.

**Humayun's Tomb**:- built by the widow of the second Mughal Emperor, Humayun, it is an outstanding monument in the Indo-Persian style, a precursor of the Taj Mahal.

The tour also includes a drive past the **imposing India Gate**, **the Parliament building and the Rashtrapati Bhawan**, **the President's residence**.



Visit the **Jama Masjid:**- The mosque of Friday was built from 1644 to 1658 during the reign of Shahjahan. The mosque which measures 65m on 35m, and whose court forms a square of 100m on side is by its surface the greatest religious construction of Islam;

Raj Ghat where Mahatma Gandhi - The Father of Nation, was cremated

The Red Fort:- the palace for Shahjahan new capital, Shahjahanabad, the seventh Muslim city in the Delhi site.

Wander in the busy streets of the mile long Chandni Chowk, popularly called "The Silver Street".

Later drive to Agra.[204, Kms – 4.5 Hrs]


Agra in terms of ambiance is still associated with its Mughal period. The Mughals besides being great rulers were also great builders and they preserved their best architectural wonders for Agra & its neighbourhood. It has many wonderful monuments and the Taj Mahal, the greatest of them all, is a masterpiece of Mughal architecture at its best.

Overnight: , Agra [Room with breakfast]

DAY 02 AGRA-JAIPUR 231 KMS, 5.5 HRS

Early morning visit Taj Mahal

The Taj Mahal (closed on Friday) - The Taj Mahal is everything that has been said about it and more. Taking 22 years and 20,000 men to build, the white marble was quarried 200 miles away and was transported to the site by a fleet of 1000 elephants. Built by the Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan as an expression of his love for his wife Mumtaz Mahal, in mid 17th century, the Taj Mahal is truly one of the wonders of the world. Though the Taj appears to be amazingly perfect from almost any angle, it is the close-up marble inlay work, which is really astounding. You will have ample time to view and be mesmerized by this outstanding piece of architecture.



Come back to the hotel for Breakfast.

After breakfast, proceed with the visit of Agra Fort:- an outstanding example of Mughal architecture. Agra Fort - the seat and the stronghold of the Mughal Empire under successive generations. This was the seat of Mughal rule and administration and the present structure owes its origins to Akbar who erected the walls and gates and the first buildings on the eastern banks of Yamuna River. Shah Jehan added the impressive quarters and the mosque while Aurangzeb added the outer ramparts. Visit its Hall of Public Audience and its Royal Pavilions.

Later drive to Jaipur [231 Kms, 4.5 hrs]

Enroute you will be visiting **Fatehpur Sikri** - the deserted red sandstone city, was built by the Great Mughal Emperor, Akbar, as his capital and palace in the late 16th century. It was abandoned soon after it was built when the local wells went dry and it remains today in much the same condition that it was over 300 years ago. It is complete with palaces and mosques

and used to be a town larger than London when it was originally constructed. Now it is an extraordinary place to wander around with its buildings in near perfect condition. Fatehpur Sikri remained the capital of the Mughal Empire for around 10 years. The complex of monuments and temples are all in a uniform architectural style.

Later continue your drive to Jaipur.

The capital of Rajasthan Jaipur - popularly known as the "Pink City "as the Pink sandstone was used to construct the buildings in Old walled city. Jaipur owes its name, its foundation and it's planning to the Great warrior astronomer Maharaja Jai Singh II (1699–1744 AD).

Assistance upon arrival at your hotel for check-in;

Overnight:, Jaipur [Room with breakfast]

DAY 03 JAIPUR 231 KMS, 5.5 HRS

After breakfast, you will be driven just outside Jaipur to the **ancient capital of Amber** to see the fabulous Amber Fort. Maharaja Mansingh, Mughal Emperor Akbar's most successful General, started the construction of Amber Fort in the 17<sup>th</sup> century. Before the City Palace was constructed in Jaipur, Amber was the seat of power. The fort is surrounded by fortified battlements and overlooks the Moat Lake. Ruins and remains are spread over the Aravalli hills



and sprawling crenulated walls lattice the surrounding area.

An elephant [Subject to availability/alternatively by jeep] will spare you the trouble of reaching up to the fortress. Once on top, stroll through the sprawling complex of courtyards and halls;

Many of the rooms have delightful wall paintings, with precious stones and mirrors inlaid in the walls. Most fascinating, perhaps, is the Sheesh Mahal (hall of mirrors) where a single lamplight is reflected in the many mirrors, lighting up the room. En-route to Amber you will stop and see the `Palace of Winds', otherwise known as Hawa Mahal. It is really an elaborate facade behind which the ladies of the court used to watch the daily goings on in the street below. It is extremely intricate in its pink sandstone carving. The cool wind blows through its facade of windows and latticed screens through which the queens of the court once viewed the streets of the city.

In the afternoon, you will visit the **City of Jaipur**. Among the highlights to be seen while touring Jaipur include the **City Palace**, which is an overwhelming complex of exquisite palaces, gardens and courtyards, decorative art and carved doorways. The palace museum houses

collections of rare manuscripts, armory, costumes, carpets and miniature paintings. Walk to the adjacent **Jantar Mantar or Astronomical Observatory** made by the Maharaja of Jaipur, built in 1726 and is one of the five such astronomical wonders built by Sawai Jai Singh and makes accurate predictions even to this day. You will also have the opportunity to wander about the local markets

Overnight:, Jaipur [Room with breakfast]

DAY 04 JAIPUR-DELHI-BANGLORE 231 KMS, 5.5 HRS

Breakfast is at hotel. Today either you will be transferred to Delhi by surface or you can take flight from Jaipur to Bangalore via flight.
